

STEP PERISCOPE PRE-BROADCAST CHECKLIST

-Create compelling headline in Notes with emojis. Paste in Periscope.
That way, if your scope is interrupted or you must restart due to spotty cell service, you can copy, paste, and immediately jump back on your scope
-Publicize that you're going to broadcast live in 5 minutes.
Let your audience on other social media platforms know you are about to scope, and tell them what you'll be discussing.
-Video yourself first, or look at yourself on your phone camera.
No need for the hiccups of out-of-place hair or lipstick on your teeth! Check yourself out before hand. Pay attention to composition. Make sure the area behind you is clutter free and pleasing to the eye.
-Sign up for katch.me if you haven't.
Your scopes will remain on the app for only 24 hours. Katch.me will capture your broadcast for viewers to watch indefinitely.
-Make sure location services is off if you're at home.
You don't want to tell the world your street address!
-Turn off your volume. Put on airplane mode
Because you don't need to be distracted by texts and phone calls while your are live!
-Choose the option to save to your phone.
You never know when you might want to repurpose your scopes!
-Find something to focus on. This is your thumbnail.
The camera will be facing away from you when you hit Broadcast. Focus on something interesting or pretty. This will become your scope's thumbnail!
-Check the lighting. Use a ring light to optimize lighting if possible.
This is an important part of looking professional. Your viewers want to see you!
-Make a list of your key points. Put it somewhere you can read it.
You certainly don't want to memorize what you'll be sharing, but be sure to have notes in front of you so nothing important is forgotten.
